A Note from the Headteacher

As the new year begins, classes are starting to learn about their new topic under the theme 'Far Away and Long Ago'.

Key Stage 1 are really looking forward to visiting the Knucker Hole, home of a local legend, and Arundel Castle as part of their local history studies, 'Dragons and Castles'.

Years 3 and 4 have already started to immerse themselves in the Roman Empire and will be learning about its impact on Britain, leading up to a visit to Fishbourne Roman Palace in November (details to follow).

Years 5 and 6 are far away and long ago in Ancient Greece, studying Greek life and achievements and their influence on the western world. They will take part in a one-day workshop in November, finding out about some of the greatest philosophers, writers and athletes.

Safety & Welfare Within School Grounds

Despite our polite reminder in last week's newsletter about supervising younger children on bikes and scooters, another serious incident took place yesterday during pick up. A heavily pregnant woman was knocked to the ground and was severely shaken. As a result, and to avoid further injuries, we will now need to insist that bikes, tricycles and scooters are either left outside of school grounds or are parked in the bike shed if entering via the back gate from School Road. We are relieved to say that mother and baby have been checked out and all is thankfully fine.

We have also noticed several children climbing trees at the front of school when being picked up from clubs. Please discourage your children from doing so – there are plenty of opportunities for tree climbing within the safe and secure environment of our Forest School sessions.

Regular reading with an adult will help your child to become a confident and fluent reader, and will hopefully develop a lifelong love of books!

As part of our democracy studies, Mr Gareth Evans, a Loxwood Councillor, will be visiting Year 5 this half-term to explain a little about how the democratic process works at a local level. Year 6 will be having a virtual tour of the Houses of Parliament and extending their understanding to a national level.

Parents and carers must also follow the guidance from the UK Health Security Agency and the NHS, which stipulates that children with diarrhoea or vomiting must remain away from school for 48 hours after their last episode.
