

At WGPS, we want all of our children to become fluent readers. Fluency is the ability to read a text accurately, quickly, and with expression. Reading fluency is important because it provides a bridge between reading words on a page and understanding what they mean. Because fluent readers do not have to concentrate on sounding words out, they can focus their attention on what the text means. This is a crucial skill that can be used across the curriculum and sets children up for future success. Top tips to support reading fluency at home

- 1. Read to your child modelling fluent reading to your child has a huge impact on their own fluency.
- 2. Listen to your child offer help when your child gets stuck!
- 3. Read it again reading familiar books provides opportunities to practise reading with expression.
- 4. Audio books a great way for your child to follow along as someone else reads.
- 5. Read a range of texts sharing different types of texts (stories, information texts, poetry, magazines) helps your child to build a broader vocabulary.
