A Note from the Headteacher

As our first half-term comes to an end, it seems an appropriate time to share how pleased teachers are with the progress children are already making. Classes are extremely settled and have adjusted to the challenges of their new year group. There will be an opportunity for parents and carers to discuss their child's progress with the class teacher during the first two weeks of the next half term. We encourage all parents to make an appointment. Please see separate letter for details.

Our monitoring and staff training priorities this term are the teaching and learning of maths and English, with a specific focus on spelling in writing and use of mathematical vocabulary. During our INSET Day, Friday 20th October, teachers will be visiting St Mary's Primary School to share good practice and see maths mastery in action across the primary age range. This will enable teachers to further refine their own practice within our mastery journey.

Last week was National Poetry Day, where everyone was encouraged to make, experience and share poetry. Oak Class learnt some poems about rockets and space and added actions to perform them. Many children noticed how many of the words rhymed with each other. Maple Class enjoyed joining in with different nursery rhymes, putting each of the actions together and performing them as a class. Hazel Class wrote their own poetry based upon the story of 'Stig of the Dump' and his feelings about finding himself in an unknown world. This complemented their Stone Age project and helped to create a bank of exciting adjectives to use in their writing journeys. Year 6 created a whole class poem based on their current text, Beowulf. The children used their amazing vocabulary to describe the monster Grendel. They even managed to make it rhyme!



Healthy Snacks

As a Healthy School we have a <u>Healthy Eating Policy and Packed Lunch Guidance</u>, which is available on our website. We have recently noticed a few unhealthy snacks at break time such as crisps or chocolate, possibly coming from lunch boxes. We have reminded the children about the importance of healthy snacks but would appreciate it if you could assist us to maintain our Healthy School status. Fresh fruit or a healthy low-sugar content snack is advised for breaktime. Reception and Key Stage One will continue to be provided with fruit each day at school. Our youngest and oldest children have been extremely excited about starting Buddy Reading this year. Each week, buddies get together to share favourite books and read together. Our Year 5 and 6 children are doing a wonderful job of helping younger children to sound out and blend and recognise tricky words. It is great to see such an enjoyment of reading being developed between our children. Well done!
