#### <u>Reindeer Run</u>




We will be holding our Reindeer Fun Day on **Wednesday 13th December** to raise sponsorship for children and young people with life-threatening and life-limiting illnesses and their families, through Chestnut Tree House, our focus charity. Children will be provided with antlers and a nose on the day to take part in a sponsored reindeer walk of a mile. They will be able to keep them afterwards to bring home.

An envelope was sent home yesterday (please check school bags) for you to collect any sponsorship money or donations raised, to be brought to school on the day or after the event up to Friday 15th December. If your child usually takes part in any of these groups, it may mean that they attend less sessions than usual or that the sessions are slightly shorter in length. We expect to return to full provision shortly.



This 65th-anniversary edition contains the very first eightchapter Paddington adventure with an introduction by Michael Bond. This beautiful hardback will be a joy to read and share. A timeless children's story, A Bear Called Paddington is the perfect book present.





400 seemingly unrelated fun historical facts neatly segue into each other on a trail that takes in ancient civilisations, sports, mythology, the history of medicine, culture and more. With compelling photography, bold graphics and quirky cartoons, children aged 8+ will be fascinated. It's perfect for children who like to dip into non-fiction. An original festive story about Brian, who finds a discarded Christmas tree and decides to take it home and care for it so that it can be used again next year. This is a sensitive and inspiring story with a clever and conscientious sense of sustainability. A good book to read and discuss with younger children.

#### Trim Trail Update

As a healthy school we are always keen to encourage children to be active, from playing outdoor games at lunchtime to taking part in a Weald sporting event, representing their school. To encourage activity at breaktimes, the school has a well-used trim trail and set of tyres for children to use. Unfortunately, during the winter months, wet weather often prevents these from being accessed. Leaders have worked tirelessly to obtain planning permission for an all-weather surface underneath our trim trail. However, our current trail is now coming to the end of its useful life and will also need to be replaced prior to the surface being installed. This will of course have further cost implications. As a result, we are collecting quotes for the work and will work closely with the PTA to explore our funding options. We will let you know as soon as we have an update.

#### <u>Swimming</u>

You may also be aware that our swimming pool was condemned following lockdown and has been out of use since then. This would require an enormous fund-raising effort and significant donations or grants if it is to be rebuilt. As soon as the new trim trail and surface have been installed, we will focus all our efforts on the swimming pool and how best to move forward. In the meantime, we will continue to provide swimming lessons at Billingshurst Leisure Centre for Year 4 and older children who have yet to achieve the required standard in swimming and water safety – life skills that are greatly valued at Wisborough Green Primary School. Your patience and support are greatly appreciated. Thank you.
