Attendance

Being in school and having the best attendance possible underpins all the many benefits of school for your child, such as their learning, wellbeing and wider development. Our average attendance so far this academic year is 96.7%, just above the national average for primary schools of 95.2%.

As a parent, you are legally responsible for making sure your child gets a suitable fulltime education from the age of 5. For most parents, this will mean making sure your child is in school every day except when:

- Your child is too ill to go to school.
- You have permission for a leave of absence from school for them not to attend. You should only ask for this in exceptional circumstances.
- Your religious body has a day especially for religious observance.

For further information regarding illness, see the NHS advice to help you decide whether they can go to school.

We understand however, that for some children, attending school every day will be harder than for others and we are committed to working together with families to solve problems and support your child's school attendance. Attending school usually helps to protect your child's mental health, for a range of reasons including giving them a chance to be with friends and to benefit from learning. However, some children can be anxious or worried about going to school. This is a normal emotion, and not necessarily indicative of an underlying mental health condition. If your child is suffering with anxiety and it is starting to become an attendance issue, please speak to us together with your child about why they are anxious and what can be done. You can also find some useful advice at Young Minds, to help work through likely reasons together with your child, what to do and how to make sure that you get the right support if there are more serious issues.

Science Week

The first week of spring term will be 'Science Week' for all our children. Week commencing 2nd January 2024, we will study our science topics in depth, focussing on a different aspect of 'how to be a scientist' each day. These will include learning and practising skills such as observation, spotting relationships and patterns, classification, completing research and presenting findings. Each class will make a film of their work to share with parents and carers later in the half term.

It will then be time to start our new 'Extreme Survival' topics with a strong geography focus as follows:

- Celebrations Around The World and Pole to Pole (EYFS)
- Pole to Pole (KS1)
- Mountains and Rivers (LKS2)
- The Americas (UKS2).

Details of each topic may be found on the <u>curriculum page</u> of our website, Cycle A. We are looking forward to a great term of outdoor learning and hope the weather plays along!

Forest School

As part of Science Week, each class will be taking part in an outdoor Forest School session as follows:

- Tuesday 2nd January Y3 am Y6 pm
- Wednesday 3rd January Y5 am Y1 pm
- Thursday 4th January Y2 am Y4 pm

If your child has a morning slot, please send them to school in their Forest School clothes, with their uniform in a labelled bag. Children taking part in the afternoon should bring their Forest School clothes in a named bag. Please remember that all wellies/boots should be left in the Welly Shed.

From week 2, all classes from Years 1 to 6 will be having music and languages (KS2) in these slots and will not need to bring any Forest School clothes for the rest of the half term.

Reception will continue their Forest School sessions on a Monday morning.

Chestnut Tree House

A reminder that we are holding our Reindeer Fun Day on **Wednesday 13th December** to raise sponsorship for children and young people with life-threatening and life-limiting illnesses and their families, through Chestnut Tree House, our focus charity. Children will be provided with antlers and a nose on the day to take part in a sponsored reindeer walk of a mile. They will be able to keep them afterwards to bring home.
