





A Note from the Headteacher


Bikeability

Year 6 have had a great time learning about bike maintenance and road safety this week as part of Bikeability. Of the 25 children who attended, 96% achieved the level 2 standard which includes passing stationary vehicles and sharing use of the road. Despite the rain, the children still said it was 'amazing' and that they felt much more confident cycling on the main roads. They practised U-turns, hand signals and cycling by themselves in traffic and they now know how to tighten their saddle and check steering, helmets, tyres and chains! Well done, Year 6!

Wraparound Care

You may have seen in the press that the Government would like to provide wraparound care for all school parents who require it by 2026. Wraparound childcare: guidance for schools and trusts in England 2024 states that, 'Local authorities are responsible for ensuring there are sufficient wraparound childcare places in their area. They will work with schools, trusts, and PVI providers (including childminders and early years providers) to do so, using government funding to set up new provision and expand existing provision, where needed.'

Further guidance for schools updated on 27th February 2024 adds, 'Once you have received a request for wraparound childcare on the school site from a parent, you should engage with the designated local authority wraparound lead and make them aware of the request. The local authority should work with the parent to consider whether there is suitable wraparound provision in the local area.' This is something that we would very much welcome for parents at Wisborough Green, and we look forward to receiving the support outlined. We will forward all recent parent enquiries to West Sussex County Council at the end of term and have already requested more information. We will be in touch when we receive a response. If you would like to make a written parent request to be submitted to WSCC, please email office@wisboroughgreenschool.org.uk and we will include it in our bundle. In the meantime, we have been advised to signpost parents and carers to their local family information service which provides information on local childcare services.
