

## English

Our key texts for this term are 'Look Up!' by Nathan Bryon and 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon.



Year 2 will be learning:

- How to write persuasive sentences
- How to use exclamation marks and question marks
- How to write descriptive sentences based on characters
- How to use similes
- How to write and perform a poem
- How to use conjunctions to order ideas and instructions
- How to form a short narrative

Year 2 will begin to learn the spelling patterns for their year group as well as practising their handwriting

## Maths

### Recap of Year 1 Numbers 10-100:

- Explain that one ten is equivalent to ten ones
- Use knowledge of facts and unitising to add and subtract multiples of ten
- Represent a number from 20-99 in different ways

### Calculations within 20:

- Add three addends
- Compare numbers and describe how many more or less there are in each set
- Use knowledge of subtraction to solve problems in a range of contexts

### Addition and subtraction of two-digit numbers:

- Add and subtract one to and from a two-digit number that crosses a tens boundary
- Use number bonds to ten to add a single-digit number to a two-digit number

### Shape:

- Describe polygons and find different ways to sort them
- Investigate how polygons can be joined and folded to form 3-dimensional shapes

### Money:

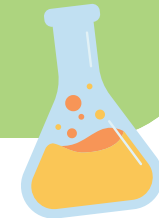
- Recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p); combine amounts to make a particular value
- Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.



## Science

### Everyday Materials:

- Identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials
- Find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching



## Computing

### Creating Media:

- Digital photography: Capturing and changing digital photographs for different purposes.

### Online Relationships:

- Explain why it is important to be considerate and kind to people online

### Core Beliefs, Ideas and Symbols:

- Learn about and understand the main beliefs of Hindu Dharma

### Main festivals/ celebration:

- Diwali
- Navarati

### Drawing and Painting:

- Carve clay, using tools and rolling pins
