Year 5 will be looking at a range of genres including non-fiction and fiction texts and poetry.

The children will be learning:

- to edit to ensure tense is mostly accurate and consistent
- to place possessive apostrophes correctly (singular and plural and including irregular plurals)
- to use a range of sentence structures (simple, compound and complex) to achieve different effects

Year 5 will continue to learn the spelling patterns for their year group as well as practising their handwriting.

Learn about and understand the main beliefs of Sikhi:

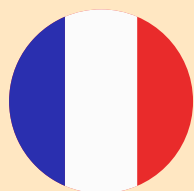
- The Five Ks

Languages

French:

- To greet someone and introduce yourself in French.

- To ask and answer a question about feelings in French.
- To name school bag objects and recognise if they are masculine or feminine.
- To ask and answer a question about something you have or do not have.
- To count beyond six in French.



History

Anglo Saxons:

- To develop a knowledge of who the Anglo Saxons, Scots and Vikings were and when they came to Britain.
- To analyse how Anglo-Saxon settlements were similar/ different from today's towns and villages.
- To evaluate how archaeologists have found out more about the Anglo-Saxons.
- To understand what Anglo-Saxons believed and how Christianity changed Anglo-Saxon life.
- To recognise why King Alfred was a significant figure in history.

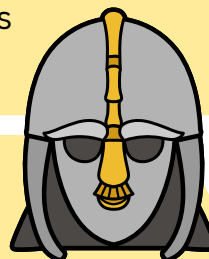
Maths

Negative numbers:

- Interpret numbers greater than and less than zero in different contexts
- Place negative numbers on a numberline
- Explain how negative numbers are used on a coordinates grid

Short multiplication and division:

- Multiply and divide a two-digit number by a single-digit number using partitioning and representations
- Use estimation to support accurate calculation
- Multiply and divide a three-digit number by a single-digit number using partitioning and representations



Art

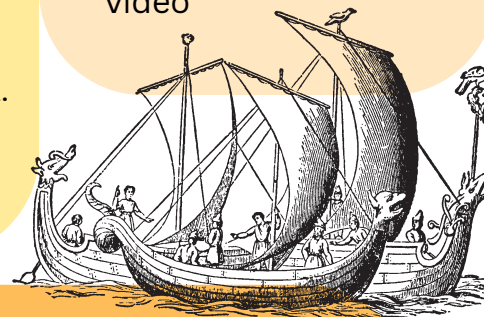
Sculpture:

Forces:

- Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object.
- Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces.
- Recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

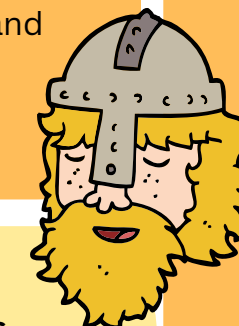
