calls out for votes to bag a share of bag charge fund

Wisborough Green Primary School is bidding to bag a massive cash boost from the Tesco Bags of Help initiative.

Tesco teamed up with Groundwork to launch its community funding scheme, which sees grants of £4,000, £2,000 and £1,000 - all raised from the 5p bag levy - being awarded to local community projects.

Three groups in every Tesco region have been shortlisted to receive the cash award and shoppers are being invited to head along to Tesco stores to vote for who they think should take away the top grant.

Wisborough Green Primary School is one of the groups on the shortlist.

We are looking to improve the travel plan of the school by installing a covered bike/scooter shelter and a 'Scooterpod' for the children to use. We also need to improve the stop and drop area at the front of the school as this will reduce the amount of parked cars on the local roads.

“This will be a fantastic project to help the children stay healthy by encouraging them to use their scooters and bikes to travel to school. We want to introduce more travel schemes to reduce the parking around the school and this can only be achieved with the support of this brilliant fundraising initiative - Thank you for your vote!”

Voting is open in stores throughout May and June. Customers will cast their vote using a token given to them at the check-out in store each time they shop.
